It's perfectly clear that this is the intended use of the developers who have already had to remove the balustrading surrounding it on the demand of Camden. In fact both of the owners estate agents have been instructed to sell the property on that basis. Please see the brochures of Tallisman Karpel and Savills. The steps out from the top floor window cannot be intended for fire purposes as anyone escaping via that route would then be trapped with no further way down. The use of this space as a terrace would have huge impact on my quality of life, in particular noise pollution and a dramatic, further loss of privacy. I believe this property is already way overdeveloped and strongly object to any further permissions being given.
