Possibly a result of the economic constraints of period. 3) few roofs of this type remain in area and are usually both in prominent locations and on listed buildings eg see also above No 304 Kentish Town RoadRoad, visible on exit from Kentish Town Underground Station and from further afield. 4) The principle of loosing this defining feature as opposed to any general negative architectural comment is the key issue. 5) The need to inhabit the roof space has to be balanced against the impact from the offset stair and dormer, the light spillage from the roof level sky-line glazing and two access doors to the one roof. These aspects are visible from the section of College Lane north of the railway line and from Ingestre Road and rear gardens 6) Note - No specific reference to this roof form is included in the listing records (please check).
