The Council has considered your application for prior approval of siting and appearance in respect of the telecommunications equipment described above determines that prior approval is required and hereby **refuses approval** for the following reasons.

#### Reason(s) for Objection

- 1 The proposed cabinets, by virtue of their siting within the High Speed 2 railway (HS2) safeguarded route as published on 16th August 2016, would impact on the ability to build and operate HS2 and the Government's objective of delivering HS2, which is an infrastructure project of national importance. The proposal is therefore contrary to guidance in the National Planning Policy Framework and the Safeguarding Directions for development affecting the route and associated works for the High Speed Two Phase One; it would thus also fail to comply with policy CS11 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core



Strategy and policy DP17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.


