The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission.

Informative(s):

The proposed bricks have been reclaimed from the demolition of part of the front elevation and therefore match in colour. In accordance with the supporting information submitted they will be laid so the darker face of the brick is on the outside. Photographic evidence has been provided to show that there is a sufficient quantity of bricks to build the consented front extension.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the



character or appearance of the conservation area, under s.72 of the Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

The site's planning history was taken into account when coming to this decision.

The full impact of the proposed development has already been assessed.

You are reminded that condition 6 (landscaping and replacement tree planting details) of planning permission 2016/5612/P dated 05/12/2016 is outstanding and requires details to be submitted and approved.
