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Dear Matthew,

Please find below my clients answers to the points you raised; which explains their design rational;

Point 1 - Yes we agree to changing the backboard black.

Point 2 - There is no problem providing a sample of the window glass (Eddie, please could you provide the pane of glass).

Point 3 - We only have one external fitting and that is the keypad reader, painted telephone box red. Could they be referring to another telephone box in Camden i.e. the coffee shop one?

Point 4 - The handle is necessary in our electronic security system to ensure a member can exit our pod in the event of a power failure in the area. We will agree to getting these spray painted red.

Point 5 - The "LED display" is the timer that is necessary in our booking and payment system. If our member has booked for 20 minutes and goes over that time, we will automatically charge their credit card for a further 20 minute slot. For legal reasons the timer has to be there so no member can say they didn't know how long they were in there for. Once a member enters the pod, the timer is activated and counts up to 20 minutes. It resets itself to zero once the member has exited the pod. We will agree to replacing with one where the LED cannot be seen from the outside.

Point 6 - "The standard desk height in the UK is 740mm and accommodates 95% of the population". Our desk is placed 6cm higher up to accommodate all the hardware concealed behind the backboard. However, to offset the 6cm increase in height, we have had an airlift stool designed and made for us in Italy that accommodates members from 4ft 6inches to 6ft 8inches in height. This offsets the desk height for 98% of our members. We believe the desk needs to be secured to comply with Health and Safety Regulations. If our member did not secure "the rise and fall" desk properly, they risk their laptop for example, falling off and breaking their toe. Who would be liable for that?

Point 7 - Yes we agree to lowering the printer / scanner shelf - to what height?

Point 8 - We agree to supplying a VOIP phone with raised numbers and an inductive coupler.

I will be sending over the revised visuals confirming the above, later today.
