The build will result in loss of light for facing buildings; the long construction period will be a huge disturbance in terms of noise pollution, dust and dirt; the local community will suffer from the loss of shops and services currently available at the site; and the build in no way fits with the architectural heritage of Bloomsbury. I would stress again the impact on the community, the residents. We have put up with a great deal of construction noise, roadworks etc in recent times, and this looks set to be even worse. Also, we do not wish to lose the shops which are presently on the site and which form an integral part of the neighbourhood fabric. I do not see anything in the revised plans that addresses these concerns.
