First, someone tried to build a large, ugly hotel on the site. Now the proposal is to squeeze 4 flats into a small site in a building of contemporary design which takes no account of the historical nature of Streatley Place. There are no modern buildings visible in Streatley Place which gives the lane its charm and sense of timelessness. Why impose a building so out of keeping in such a sensitive location?
					Second, the construction of this building is going to have a prolongued impact on the neigbourhood. Not only do I live a few metres from the site, I also work from home. We are told that construction will last 52-72 weeks. There will be months of pile-driving. Apparently local rules allow the builders to work on Satrudays and Sunday mornings as well. This is not the right place to plan such a major construction project, ther are plenty of derelict sites in London where this type of project could be done. It makes no sense to do it in Streatley Place and places the children at the school and local neigbours at risk due to the flow of equipment, rubble and building material along a major pedestrian thorough-fare.
