1 Reason for granting:

Condition 4 requires the submission of details of secure and covered cycle storage area for 3 or 4 cycles, the permission was for 3 units and is considered 3 is suffice.

The proposal is a secure storage of bikes with Sheffield bike stands within the existing internal courtyard for these flats and it can only be gained access via controlled gate for the residents only. The stands are minimal and does negligible harm to the appearance of the property.



With the above taken into consideration the bike parking is considered acceptable for this development.

The planning history of the site has been taken into account when coming to this decision. No comments were received prior to making this decision.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies CS5 and CS11 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP17, DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
