The Council has considered your application and decided to grant approval.

1 Reasons for approving the details:

The submission includes detailed hard and soft landscaping plans, a play area plan, drainage and external levels details and a planting plan. The majority of the landscaping details were partially discharged under 2015/3016/P with only details



of the play area and the surface levels remaining. This application has now fully discharged this condition by providing the reserved details.

Details of the playground were independently reviewed by a play specialist and have been agreed by the Council's Green Space Development Officer. The equipment type and spacing is considered to be acceptable.

Surfacing details of areas adjoining the public highway have been coordinated and agreed with the Council's Engineers who find them acceptable.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies CS5 and CS14 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework.

The applicant is advised that the following conditions associated with planning permission 2012/6372/P dated 31/10/2013 require the submission of further details: 17c (the remaining remediation works for Block 2).

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
