Dear Amy

Further to our recent telephone conversation on the subject of your email to Simon (see below) I have discussed your comments with my Client and have attached a drawing of a revised scheme for your consideration.

Here we have done as you requested by reducing the size of the terrace by 50%, setting the terrace back 5000mm from the rear boundary and delineating the back of the terrace by a row of planters. The concrete roof of the existing storage units will now be covered with artificial grass, as real grass would not flourish under the trees. We have had to retain the balustrade for safety reason, as required under the Building Regulations.

On the assumption that the proposal is acceptable, I will shortly provide you with any further information that you may require.

Hi Simon

Further to my site visit on Friday, I wish to advise we would not approve the roof terrace as it stands.

 The size and scale of the terrace is completely inappropriate to the surroundings and would be detrimental to the character of the conservation area.

- 2. In terms of residential amenity, overlooking would occur to properties No. 27, 29 Lyndhurst Road, and to the rears of 18-22 Wedderburn Rd. I do not consider the proposed camouflage screening an acceptable solution due to its impermanent nature and unattractive appearance. The camouflage screening would not integrate with the site, appearing as a dominant addition and out of context with the surroundings. The visual impact to the adjacent neighbours with the addition of this screening would be significant and would greatly reduce the amenity that existed previously.
- Furthermore, the plans submitted are not accurately representative of the site due to the raise in levels of approximately 16cm.
- 4. An Arboricultural Report was not submitted to sufficiently demonstrate protection to the trees. We require this to be submitted as I have discussed with our landscaping officer and we are not convinced the trees have been suitably protected.

As such, I request that amendments are made to the plans to address the above information. We would accept a roof terrace that is set back further from the rear boundary line so that no screening is required to prevent overlooking and of a sufficiently smaller scale (at least half of the width of the existing). We would then be able to grant approval subject to enforcement action which would require you to amend the roof terrace to comply with the approved plans.

Please also submit an Arboricultural Report demonstrating that the trees have been protected.

I would request this information is provided to me within 10 days.

If I do not hear back from you in the timeframe requested I will recommend the proposal for a refusal.
