Bristol House is largely a residential block of 26 flats, poorly described by the applicants, and the plans submitted nowhere show how near their proposed building is to Bristol House. The Light report is confusing and for some reason only mentions the second floor to be affected by a four storey building. How much worse must the loss of light be for the flats directly below those listed (originally 9, 10 and 11 poorly described) : Add Flats 1, the Alexander and Treatment Centres (a medical resource) and Flats 4, 5. and 6 all below. Four floors of building must also affect the third floor Flats 14, 15 and 16. Amenities of all these flats will be reduced by light loss, looking more closely on to plain walls, with likely additional plant noise and construction noise and dust in an enclosed space. The application understates the effects of a building crowding in on the whole of Bristol House and its residents.
