The Council has considered your application and confirms that the proposals are acceptable as non-material amendments to the planning permission set out above.

Informative(s):

The alteration to the fenestration of the approved rear extension is considered to represent a minor amendment that would not harm the appearance of the host



building or the character of the surrounding area. Subsequently, the proposed amendments are considered to be non-material in the context of the original scheme and do not raise any new issues or alter the substance of the approved development.
