I read the application documents for Windmill House with interest and I am now writing to propose to reject the application.

- The new parking bay would negatively affect the appearance of one of the best preserved parts of Hampstead.
- The commitment to reinstate the current appearance when the current occupant moves out is a false pretence. The new occupant will probably drag their feet and possibly apply to keep it. I have observed how a house just across the road from where I live was refurbished in blatant contravention of several major and unambiguous undertakings made in the planning documents. In spite of my objections these well-documented breaches were simply retrospectively agreed anyway, and we are left with a permanent eyesore.
