The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** advertisement consent for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed internally illuminated fascia sign, by reason of its width, height and detailed design, would be detrimental to the character and appearance of the host building, the adjoining parade of shopfronts and the area generally. Thus, the proposal is contrary to policies CS5 (Managing the impact of growth and development) and CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy; policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP30 (Shopfronts) of the



London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development; Policies D1 (Design), D2 (Heritage), D3 (Shopfronts) and D4 (Advertisement) of the Draft Camden Local Plan 2016 and policy D4 of the Kentish Town Neighbourhood Forum.

Informative(s):

The emerging Camden Local Plan is reaching the final stages of its public examination. Consultation on proposed modifications to the Submission Draft Local Plan began on 30 January and ended on 13 March 2017. The modifications have been proposed in response to Inspector's comments during the examination and seek to ensure that the Inspector can find the plan 'sound' subject to the modifications being made to the Plan. The Local Plan at this stage is a material consideration in decision making, but pending publication of the Inspector's report into the examination only has limited weight.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
