See <a href="https://goo.gl/maps/NikCu8rqFAR2">https://goo.gl/maps/NikCu8rqFAR2</a> . The furniture includes – large structure for access to pedestrian tunnel, mature tree, electrical cabinets, posts for junction lights, CCTV, , etc. This street is always busy with people since it is a major pedestrian access to a major underground station and double mainline and international station (King's Cross and St Pancras).</p> <p>The last thing this pavement needs is a telephone box. Firstly with the prevalence of mobile phones practically no one uses telephone boxes any more. And anyway St Pancras station provides a few, very nearby.</p> <p>With all the fast food outlets and shops selling alcohol this street attracts litter and drunks. A phone box in this location will immediately become an ugly eyesore – strewn with litter, graffitied, covered in stickers and advertisements for prostitutes. It will also become a de facto urinal.</p> <p>We know all of this because that is exactly what happens with these nearby phone boxes: <a href="https://goo.gl/maps/AFJzyNVduYP2">https://goo.gl/maps/AFJzyNVduYP2</a> - you can see the stickers on the panels and the graffiti.</p> <p>Lastly, this is a Conservation Area, and this location is dominated by the Grade I listed St Pancras Chambers and the Grade I listed King's Cross Station. Telephone boxes would be harmful.</p> <p>Surely there is no doubt that the only reason for this application is an attempt to slip a revenue-earning, advertisement-displaying item through the planning system? Please reject this phone box and all other such applications.</p>

The current structure (TFL UNderground Exit to 23 Eustin Road) is already proving a breeding a breeding ground to criminal activity (spotting people withdrawing money from Barclays ATM, Vagrancy, Drug dealing), anti-social behaviour, Health &amp; Safety risk when exiting aforementioned station exit. The addition of a further structure to an already dense area will only increase the risk of increasing the risks to public safety.</p> <p>It is requested to be formally noted that we are in close contact with Camden's street team, BTP, TFL and Metropolitan Police to deal with a very problematic hotspot.</p> <p>If applicant would consider additional measures to proactively deal with the current issues at the stated location, we may reconsider our stance.</p> <p>We OBJECT to the application in its current form. We strongly recommend that EHO will review this application and minutely study the H&amp;S risks and potential loss of life this will bring.</p>
