Please could you assist me in dealing with severe concerns over this application:

Noise

Any pumping equipment is likely to generate noise, particularly in this exceptionally quiet location, and this is more likely given the power of the pump needed to force 10,000 litres uphill to the club facilities. Please can officers require to see, and to share with residents:

- (i) details of the equipment proposed, both the pump and the filling mechanism of the 10,000 litre tank ie is pump diesel powered?
- (ii) the acoustic survey of background noise level, and assessment of the acoustic enclosure required for the pump house and the tank, to protect the amenity of residents

- (iii) details of the proposed conditions of the acoustic enclosures to ensure noise levels are limited to 5 dBA below background noise at the quietest time of night, anti-vibration mounts, maintenance and switch off provisions if the equipment exceeds the noise levels
- (iv) the proposed controlled hours of operation

Appearance

There appears to be no housing around the 10,000 litre storage tank, nor details of the wooden structure around the pump. What will these look like from the playing field, the street and upper storeys of nearby houses? How is visual amenity to be safeguarded and the conservation area to be preserved and enhanced?

Description:

This is incomplete as there is NO reference to the pump which is so large that it requires its own 8' x 8' storage building. The description should be amended and the proposal re-consulted.
