- T1 Lime, Tillia vulgaris left side boundary wall closest to house Prune selected branch ends only to provide up to 3m clearance from building. Crown lift branch ends to provide 3m clearance above ground level. Crown clean. Reason: Routine Maintenance
- T2 Lime, Tillia vulgaris- left side boundary wall. Crown lift branch ends to provide 3m clearance above ground level and crown clean. Reason: Routine Maintenance.

T3 to T11 - Eight closely planted limes forming screening function along rear boundary. Reduce at 8m above ground level. Reason: These trees are self-evidently planted as inter-property screening for which they provide a function. The group have however been neglected and trees are excessively drawn and laterally a-symmetrical. The intention of the proposed works is to shape and contain what exists whilst retaining the inter-property screening at first and second floor levels. Once reduced, it is expected that the trees will rapidly respond with new top growth and, produce epicormic growth off stems that will also enhance lower level screening. Whilst we do not expect the principle and intention of the work proposed to be controversial, it is acknowledged that there is scope for an opinion regarding the height of cut. We suggest 8m above ground level now, as the initial thought of cutting at 6m may be considered too intense an operation at this time. We would welcome the borough arboricultrist's final decision in the detail of this matter should his or her opinion be that a different height of pruning be preferred.

T12 - Norway Maple/ Acer platanoides - at approximate midpoint of Right-hand boundary: Crown lift to 4m above garden level by removing secondary branches only. Prune selected branch ends to provide up to 3m clearance from building elevation. Crown clean.

T13 - Himalayan Rowan- Sorbus hupehensis - Remove climber and crown clean. Reason: routine maintenance
