The conservation guidelines are very clear that any replacement of windows should be original style and timber. This is a conservation area! Respect it! Briardale Gardens has been designed in its virtual entirety as Hampstead's first example of an Edwardian garden suburb street, of distinctive, interlocking rus in urbs cottages by a leading architect of the day. Aluminium windows are completely out of character. No 1 is an anchoring house, and therefore its look is of particular importance and its heritage should be respected. Camden must insist on wooden casement windows. Please also respect neighbours concerns over potential intrusiveness of extension. |
