DECISION

Proposal:

Display of 1x internally illuminated digital screen facing inwards to the existing bus shelter structure no. CAM0004AB

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions and Reasons:

- 1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.



- 2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to
- (a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);
 - (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or aid to navigation by water or air; or
 - (c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 5 Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 6 The advertisement display shall be statically illuminated and the intensity of the illumination of the digital signs shall not exceed 2500 candelas per square metre during the day and 600 candelas per square metre during the hours of darkness in line with the maximum permitted recommended luminance as set out by 'The Institute of Lighting Professional's 'Professional Lighting Guide 05: The Brightness of Illuminated Advertisements' 2015. The levels of luminance on the digital signs should be controlled by light sensors to measure the ambient brightness and dimmers to control the lighting output to within these limits.

REASON: To ensure that the advertisement does not harm the character of the area and does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies CS5, CS14 and CS17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP21, DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, policies A1, D1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan Submission Draft 2016 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

- 7 The digital sign shall not display any moving, or apparently moving, images (including animation, flashing, scrolling three dimensional, intermittent or video elements).

REASON: To ensure that the advertisement does not harm the character of the area and does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies CS5, CS14 and CS17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP21, DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, policies A1, D1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan Submission Draft 2016 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

- 8 No music or sound shall be emitted from the advertisements.

Reason: To safeguard the amenities of the adjoining premises and the area generally in accordance with the requirements of policies CS5 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies and policies and policies A1 and A4 of the emerging Camden Local Plan 2016.

- 9 The minimum display time for each advertisement shall be 10 seconds.

REASON: To ensure that the advertisement does not harm the character of the area and does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies CS5, CS14 and CS17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP21, DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, policies A1, D1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan Submission Draft 2016 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

- 10 The interval between advertisements shall take place over a period no greater than one second; the complete screen shall change with no visual effects (including fading, swiping or other animated transition methods) between displays and the display will include a mechanism to freeze the image in the event of a malfunction.

REASON: To ensure that the advertisement does not harm the character of the area and does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies CS5, CS14 and CS17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP21, DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, policies A1, D1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan Submission Draft 2016 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

- 11 No advertisement displayed shall resemble traffic signs, as defined in section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

REASON: To ensure that the advertisement does not create a distraction to

pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies CS5, CS14 and CS17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP21 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, policies A1, D1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan Submission Draft 2016 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

- 12 The footway and carriageway on the Transport for London Road Network (TLRN) and Strategic Road Network (SRN) must not be blocked during the installation and maintenance of the advertising panel. Temporary obstruction during the installation must be kept to a minimum and should not encroach on the clear space needed to provide safe passage for pedestrians, or obstruct the flow of traffic.

REASON: To ensure that the advertisement does not create a distraction to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and therefore cause a hazard to highway safety. In accordance with the requirements of policies CS5, CS14 and CS17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP21 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, policies A1, D1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan Submission Draft 2016 and Transport for London Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.

Informative(s):

- 1 Reasons for granting permission.

The proposed digital screen display units are considered acceptable in terms of size, location and method of illumination. It is accepted that all advertisements are intended to attract attention and the proposed advertisement is replacing and existing internally illuminated advertising panel that forms part of the structure of the existing bus shelter. The site is located on a wide busy road in a predominately residential area in front of the garden adjacent to a residential estate. It is acknowledged there are no examples of similar advertisements in the immediate locality; however, conditions to ensure that the digital display replicates the existing advertisement panel are recommended. The scheme was amended to restrict the digital advertisement to the inside edge of the bus shelter. The digital advert would be static, with controlled times of how long one image can be displayed and controls on the change over time between each advert. Given the digital panel is in the position of the existing advertisement it would not be considered unduly dominant in the street scene and the impact on the visual amenity of the area would not be considered harmful. To mitigate any impact on the locality, lower levels of illumination and restrictions on the rate of change of the display are secured by condition attached to this consent to reduce the impact of the display.

Whilst the method of illumination would cause some light spill, the position of the screens on the existing bus shelter structure would be an appropriate distance facing away from the nearest neighbouring occupiers which are at Denton, are set back and at upper levels. To mitigate any impact on the nearby residential

buildings, lower levels of illumination, restrictions on the rate of change of the display and prohibiting any noise/music from the units are secured by condition attached to this consent to reduce the impact of the display. This is a single sided screen facing inwards to the bus shelter and therefore only viewed in the north-west bound direction. On balance, the proposed screens would not be considered significantly harmful to neighbouring occupiers.

In terms of size, siting and method of illumination the proposal is not considered detrimental to highways safety. The double sided panel would form an integral part of the existing bus shelter structure would be located at an appropriate distance from road junctions and pedestrian crossings. As the advertisement would be seen by drivers in moving traffic, this decision includes a condition that restricts the display of moving images. Subject to conditions, the locations of the advertisements within the structure are not considered to be hazardous to vehicular or pedestrian traffic and therefore raise no public safety concerns.

The site's planning history has been taken into account when coming to this decision.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies CS5, CS14 and CS17 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP21, DP24 and DP26 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, policies A1, D1, D4 and T1 of the Camden Local Plan Submission Draft 2016. The proposed development also accords with the policies of the London Plan 2016, The National Planning Policy Framework 2012 and Transport for London's Guidance for Digital Roadside Advertising 2013.


- 2 The Inspector's report on the Local Plan was published on 15 May 2017 and concludes that the plan is 'sound' subject to modifications being made to the Plan. While the determination of planning applications should continue to be made in accordance with the existing development plan until formal adoption, substantial weight may now be attached to the relevant policies of the emerging plan as a material consideration following publication of the Inspector's report, subject to any relevant recommended modifications in the Inspector's report.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
