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1.0 Description of Works

2.0 Arrival and Delivery

- 2.1 The Green Roofer's team will consist of 3, who will arrive on site for inductions on Monday, 03 April 2017
- 2.2 The Green Roofer team will also receive a tool box talk which will cover the essential information of the project and the expectations of the management team and client, including a thorough discussion of this document. The team supervisor will have access to this document, either in printed copy or through electronic means. The team will be expected to sign form GR04.01 which acknowledges a thorough understanding of the tool box talk and the induction process
- 2.3 All equipment will be delivered to site with mechanical offload undertaken by others, if required.
- 2.4 All equipment will be checked for suitability prior to arrival on site, and by a visual inspection every morning by the team supervisor and operator.
- 2.5 Our first delivery will be scheduled for Monday, 03 April 2017, with subsequent deliveries booked on to site by the team supervisor.
- 2.6 Offloading of these materials will be undertaken by forks or crane (as appropriate) as agreed in the pre-start meeting.
- 2.7 Access to the site will be
- 2.8 Deliveries will be made to Kingsgate School Site development entrance
- 2.9 It is our company policy that ALL our operatives will hold CSCS cards

3.0 Duration and hours of work

- 3.1 The duration of this project will be 5 days And be undertaken in 1 Phase
- 3.2 Our hours of work will be from 08.00 to 16:30 on a daily basis.
- **3.3** We will undertake weekend work only with prior agreement of the site management team

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4.0 <u>Reporting</u>

- 4.1 All operatives will conform to the onsite rules and regulations as imposed by Graham Construction Ltd in terms of health and safety, site management and reasonable instructions given by Graham Construction Ltd
- 4.2 Graham Construction will issue the Contractors Induction Booklet and induction training which outlines their procedures for contracts working on site. This will be read and signed before works can commence.
- 4.3 The Green Roofers will have a working supervisor on site
 - 4.3.1 Supervisor will be Dean Bedford
 - 4.3.2 Supervisor can be contacted on 07926 454798
- 4.4 A visiting contracts manager will also be responsible for inspecting the quality of works and that the health and safety rules are adhered to
 - 4.4.1 The visiting contracts manager will be Ryan Hendy
 - 4.4.2 The visiting contracts manager can be contacted on 07506 786 721

5.0 Sequence of Works

5.1 Agreed Program details

6.0 Schedule of Plant and tools

- 6.1 Hand tools including manual cutting equipment
- 6.2 All equipment will be inspected and recorded as required.

7.0 Lifting / handling

- 7.1 All manual handling will be limited to units under 20kg. All staff will be appropriately trained about manual handling with tool box talks at regular intervals.
- 7.2 All heavier items will be lifted mechanically



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8.0 <u>PPE</u>

8.1 At a minimum, PPE required will be safety boots, HI-viz vest, task suitable gloves, ear protection (where required), suitable safety glasses or safety goggles.

9.0 Public / third party protection

- 9.1 All colleague contractors will be informed as to our area of operations and encouraged to be vigilant with the passage of our machinery.
- 9.2 Where required, after a suitable risk assessment, control measures will be implemented to exclude other parties from our areas of works.
- 9.3 Barriers and signage will be incorporated into our works where appropriate following a suitable risk assessment

10.0 First Aid and Accident Reporting

- 10.1 Graham Construction emergency procedures will define these arrangements.
- 10.2 The First aid station is located in the site offices
- 10.3 All accidents must be reported to the Green Roofers head office and Graham Construction Site management immediately.

11.0 Emergency Procedures

- 11.1 The Graham Construction emergency procedures must be followed when on site.
- 11.2 In an emergency please leave the work area by the nearest fire exit and muster at the assembly point outside site offices or car park
- 11.3 The nearest hospital to the site with an accident and emergency unit is University College Hospital, 235 Euston Road, NW1 2BU

12.0 Welfare and Discipline

- 12.1 The site welfare facilities will be used by our operatives, they will not be abused, misused and treated with respect.
- 12.2 Operatives will not leave any rubbish in the welfare and canteen areas
- 12.3 Welfare facilities on site will be in full compliance with the Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2007



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
- 12.4 The principle contractors staff and representatives will be treated in a courteous manner at all times.
- 12.5 All operatives will be dress in an appropriate manner in clothing which identifies themselves as Green Roofer employees
- 12.6 Our operatives are requested to refrain from using foul language and abusive behavior
- 12.7 Smoking will not take place within the working environment except in areas designated by the main contractor
- 12.8 Breeches of discipline will be taken extremely seriously by the management team and thorough investigation will be undertaken where such breaches occur. The investigation may result in disciplinary action being taken, which may result in dismissal from site or in serious breaches, the business.



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13.0 Method of Operation

- 13.1 All setting out will be undertaken by the client. This includes any details of finish levels etc. These will all be agreed prior to commencing works
- 13.2 Operatives will wear a harness at all time whilst operating on the roof and be connected to inertia reels providing required access and preventing over-stretch whilst on the roof.
- 13.3 Materials will be delivered to the working area by means of a fork lift which will be lifted on to a predesigned loading platform
- 13.4 Substrate will be used to ballast the insulation if any area is incomplete at the end of a working shift
- 13.5 Wherever possible the materials will be distributed to the working face immediately, and in some instances the bags of substrate will be split whilst hanging from the lifting equipment for reasons of speed and efficiency
- 13.6 Operatives will cut any drainage board to size with the use of suitable cutting equipment
- 13.7 Tools such as rakes and brooms will be employed to move substrate to the required place and thickness
- 13.8 Substrate will be fully watered prior to installing and vegetation
- 13.9 Watering points will be allocated on the roof and agreed prior to commencement.
- 13.10 Mats, seeds or plugs will be incorporated last but within 24 hours of arrival on site.
- 13.11 A pebble boarder will be installed to the perimeter of the roof and around all obstructions such as vents and skylights
- 13.12 If there is any mechanical cutting to be undertaken, this will be done in an area specified by the client which is deemed acceptable.
- 13.13 The area where the saw will be situated will be have protection laid above the waterproofing, so as to avoid any possible puncturing of the membrane. The area will also be cordoned to prevent access by other site personnel who are unauthorized or untrained.
- 13.14 Upon completion the roof will be inspected by the visiting contracts manager and will be handed to the client "as complete"
- 13.15 The client will be issued with maintenance instructions unless a maintenance package has been agreed upon.


