Coptic Street is a residential street which already has 5 restaurants not including the two on the corner of New Oxford street.

my flat is directly opposite 6 Coptic street - my bedroom window is directly opposite. If a restaurant/bar is opened on the ground and basement floor (I am on the 1st floor) - I will continually receive light pollution from the lights in the restaurant - noise pollution (there is too much already from other restaurants in the street) from people coming in and out and this will be directly outside by bedroom window and the others in the block although the first floor grabs most of the noise and the light. There will be cooking smells and god forbid music - it is just not feasible to open a bar/restaurant here in a town house as such - it should not be allowed for environmental health and to keep the community spirit and tradition of the dwelling and area - this is town house.

I am already stressed from the noise and light and aromas from the other establishments and the late night traffic of people noise - deliveries of goods/foods to restaurant - taking waste etc. Coptic street is narrow and cannot accommodate more noise/light/smells from another bar/restaurant premises not to mention more delivery vans waste etc.

I live with multiple sclerosis and stress makes my symptoms worse. To have a bar/restaurant directly next to my bedroom window would make my flat uninhabitable as there would be not respite from noise light etc.  
This applications cannot be allowed to proceed
