


ref: appeal against planning application 2017/3208/T

I wish to urgently appeal against an application by Bedford Estates developers to remove/cut back several trees in a centuries old garden space between our block of flats in Cranfield House on Southampton Row and Bedford Place. The planning ref is 2017/3208/T.

My address is Flat 31 Cranfield House, 97 Southampton Row, London WC1B4HH.

I represent the directors of the Right to Manage committee for Cranfield House, whose 32 flats look down onto this peaceful, wildlife rich habitat. The strip of land concerned is a natural habitat for many species of birds, including:

Jay, Greater Spotted Woodpecker, Wren, Blue and Great Tits, Greenfinch, Magpie, Doves, Robin, all of which are seen to breed and live there. The garden also provides refuge for a family of foxes.

The vegetation involved provides precisely the cover needed for this wildlife, a green oasis in a very urban area. The trees must also play a role in absorbing air pollution.

I urgently ask Camden to visit and assess this application carefully before giving permission for the housing development to go ahead.
