Cross Opportunity Area.

Observations Comments from the Regent's Canal CAAC.

> Fitting such a huge building into the urban fabric, as the parameters of the 2006 outline consent permit and encourage, without overpowering the surrounding features and the people who pass by, presents quite a challenge. After studying the proposals, we believe this has been ably achieved for the most part, and the scope and imagination of the facilities provided are superior to those of the previous

approved scheme.

However, we have considerable misgivings at the northern end, where the facades are the largest and most exposed. Granary Square is the centrepiece of Kings Cross Central,

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while the historic Regent's Canal and railway buildings deserve enduring standards of architectural design. The division into four horizontal layers with uniformly repeated cornices is crudely handled and the treatment is overemphatic, whereas a calming effect is called for at this scale. The handling of the elements within the panels at the subsidiary scale seems over complex and ill thought through. The inevitable shade that will be cast on the square is already on the downside. So we ask that the architecture of the northern elevation be reconsidered.
