Low-paid employees in the stalls are not farmers. This market brings no incomes into West Hampstead. I recognise how some locals believe they will have a personal pleasure in that road, any day they like, with their own tastes in food or flowers. But unfortunately this advantage must be balanced against the serious disadvantage and non-personal safety rights of commuters and other needs. Despite council regulations attempting to control individual market vehicles there will be long term, daily interference with the parking spaces and the movements for all other vehicles around this already heavily congested zone.
