All other properties have roof terraces at the 2nd floor level. 2. We had no objection to the roof terrace at 2nd floor level as this is not directly overlooking our garden but at this ground floor level, it would be virtually on top of us. 3. Myself and many neighbours have complained about the bifold doors that were added without permission as they cause a lot of overlooking and would obviously lead to a terrace but were ASSURED by the council that a terrace would NOT be allowed and a Juliet balcony would be enforced. 4. A screened terrace would give the occupants privacy but would not give privacy to the neighbours. (you can look out but not see in) 5. There would be no way to stop future occupants from scaling down the screen or removing it altogether.
