

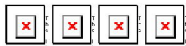

I would like to add my support to the KLPA comments on this application as detailed below.

1. Welcome a much more modest development, based on needs of the resident owners
2. Welcome the more open and consultative approach and hope that this will continue throughout any building work which might be given permission.
3. Pleased that the intention is to minimise and manage any construction traffic in Millfield Lane
4. Will need to be mindful of numbers of women accessing Ladies' Pond and other lane users throughout the year, including people with disabilities, children, dog walkers etc.
5. Assurances need to be maintained that Ladies' Pond entrance not to be used as turning space, and that times when traffic may be moving clearly advertised.
6. Use of traffic marshalling system along lane essential, as well as plans for allowing access for emergency services.
7. Developers will need to be mindful of good conduct in lane and near to Ladies' Pond of any of their employees and sub-contractors. Welcome an interest in working with National Association of Women in Construction.
8. Surface of Millfield Lane and tree roots, verges etc to be protected. Lane to be restored to current condition when work has finished.
