Proposed Work:

REAR GARDEN: Row of Cork Oak - Reduce lateral and sub-lateral branches growing over garden by approximately 30%

- 1 x Birch Thin crown density by 25%
- 1 x Cork Oak Thin crown density by 40%, raise crown by 20%
- 1 x Acacia Thin crown density by 20-25% by removing epicormic growth, raise crown by approx. 3m by removing low epicormic growth from main stem

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 12 July 2017 and does not wish to object.

- 1 This notice is valid for 2 years from the date of this letter or until the work is completed, whichever is the sooner.
- You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
