Regarding planning proposal 2017/3900/P

- ∞ **Proposal** Erection of outbuilding comprising single storey garden room, single storey building containing sauna, outdoor plunge pool, and associated ground level terrace

I strongly object to this proposal. This home is in a conservation area cherished, in part, for its green spaces and natural plant and animal life. The proposed new building and "plunge pool" would compromise this green space, would impact amenity because of the lights that would no doubt be installed (the plan being suspiciously silent on them) to illuminate the building, terrace and the "plunge pool," and the noise that would be caused during evening use. (I am assuming the "plunge pool," on which the plan also suspiciously lacks any real information, is going to be a. heated and b. possibly be a jacuzzi fitted with water jets. At a minimum this would foster evening use and at a maximum would create noise from the jacuzzi itself and the mechanism to run it).

If such new buildings, plunge pools and, presumably, lighting are allowed in people's gardens, what protection do our green spaces have, and what hope do we have to maintain amenity.

I urge you to reject this proposal for overdevelopment.
