Address: Marine Ices 4-8a Haverstock Hill & 45- 47 Crogsland Road London NW3 2BL

Proposal: Details of Landscaping in relation to Condition 5 of planning permission 2015/0487/P (dated 22/12/2016) for demolition of existing buildings with retention of facade at 45-47 Crogsland Road and construction of a part 4/part 5 storey building.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission.

Informative(s):

1 The Council's Trees and Landscaping Officer has reviewed the details submitted and confirmed that the quality and sustainability of the proposed landscaping at the site is acceptable. It is proposed to install containerised hedging of minimum 1400mm height, which is considered a sufficient height to protect views across the terrace between opposing residential units. All planters shall be maintained by an irrigation system and maintenance sub-contractor arrangements.
