Condition 16 Bird and bat boxes

Details of bird and bat boxes have been submitted, in accordance with the condition. The Council's Nature Conservation Service has assessed the above planning application against the biodiversity evidence base and considers that the



provided details of bird and boxes box designs and locations is sufficient to fulfil the requirements of Condition 16 of planning permission ref 2014/6068/P. Given the above, officers consider that the condition can be discharged.

No objections have been received prior to making this decision. A query was received about publication of the document. The error was rectified and the documents were made public. The site's planning history and relevant appeal decisions were taken into account when coming to this decision.
