Attic conversion to create 1 x 1bedroom flat and the insertion of rooflights to the front and rear elevations.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

- The proposed development, by virtue of its lack of outlook and substandard size would not provide adequate living facilities for future occupiers contrary to policies A1 and H1 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
- The proposed development, in the absence of a legal agreement securing car-free housing, would be likely to contribute unacceptably to parking stress and congestion in the surrounding area, contrary to policy T2 (Parking and car-free development) of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
- The proposed development fails to provide secure covered cycle parking for future occupants, which would therefore fail to promote cycle usage in the borough,



contrary to policy T1 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

Without prejudice to any future application or appeal, the applicant is advised that reason for refusal No. 2 could be overcome by entering into a S106 legal agreement with the Council for a scheme that was in all other respects acceptable.
