We cannot see any horns on the sashes which suggests that they date from before about 1850. We would ask that the sashes are re-examined to check their date and if actually original we would prefer they were kept. In amongst the papers we found a mocked-up photo of the rear, showing a mansard across
					the entire building. This is contradicted by the elevations drawings, which propose a mansard on only the northern section. The view from the rear, from the Colonnade itself, is particularly important this building forms the focus of that view. We are opposed to a mansard on the 'bridge' building since it, a) changes the character of that view completely and, b) distorts the proportions of that bridge. We are also opposed to any mansard on the front elevation. The recreated terrace to the south was modelled on these subject buildings and thus they have no mansard. To now add a mansard to any of the models just makes a joke of that attempt to keep the historically accurate roofline. In addition to these points a mansard added to a 4-storey building is one storey too many and puts greedy developers wishes in front of the duty to "preserve or enhance" a conservation area.
