I am writing to you with regards with planning application - 2017/0969/P.  
I hope it is not too late but I was not aware of this planning application before.

If possible could you please add to the file that as a mother of three young children I strongly disagree with those 4 antennas and 6 amplifier radio units? It is located very close to so many schools: St Anthony ( where I have one boy), Devonshire House, Fitzjohn school, North bridge House to name only the closest ones. It is the health of hundreds of children that we are putting at risk with those antennas. We do not know for sure what will be the consequences for their health but in doubt I think we should limit their exposition to the radiation.

Personally I have a very good signal with my phone in Hampstead and i am not sure we need additional antennas.

In addition, we also need to keep in mind that those children already go to schools in the most polluted streets of Hampstead as Fitzjohn avenue and Rosslyn Hill are just a catastrophe in terms of car emissions. Do we really need to add that on the list of things they will be exposed to? what are we going to say to them if they have any health issue in the future?
