The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 28 September 2017 and decided to **OBJECT** for the following reasons:


Reasons for objection:

- 1 The two trees in question are very highly visible from the public realm, they are considered to provide a high level of visual amenity within the public realm and make a positive contribution to the character of the conservation area where there are trees in many of the front gardens.
The notification alleges that the trees are contributing to subsidence at the property, however the evidence submitted is considered to be insufficient to justify felling trees that are worthy of being brought under the protection of a TPO. No ash roots have been identified beneath the foundations. No level monitoring has been submitted to demonstrate seasonal movement.



A Tree Preservation Order has been served on the tree/s and no work should be carried out without the prior consent of the Council.
