Variation of condition 2 of planning permission PS9904721 dated 21/07/2000 to allow for uses falling within business use (Class B1) across all floors.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed development would result in an unacceptable loss of employment floorspace (Light Industry) to the detriment of the loss of continued occupation by the Jewellery Industry, contrary to policies E1 and E2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.



Informative(s):

- 1 Please note that this application is solely considered to vary condition 2 which restricted the third floor only. As for the second floor restricted under the S106 legal agreement this would have to be considered under:
 - 1. a deed of variation to vary the s106 agreement, rather than condition 2 of the permission as condition 2 relates to the third floor only; and
 - 2. if such an application was made then the Council would need to consider whether comparable floor space in the basement has been secured for B1c use (as per the agreement).

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
