The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

The submitted details fail to demonstrate that the installed plant/machinery/equipment complies with the acceptable noise thresholds as secured by conditions 11 and 13 of application 2015/3916/P, resulting in noise and



disturbance to the detriment of the residential amenities of adjoining occupiers contrary to policies CS5 and CS7 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, policies DP26, DP28 and DP12 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

The Director of Culture and Environment will instruct the Borough Solicitor to issue an Enforcement Notice alleging a breach of planning control.
