Prune T2 Apple located at the back of property right side according to the following specifications:

- Clean, thin and reduce crown as necessary to promote fruit production and quality. Fruit tree pruning will reduce the risk of branch failure due to excessive fruit production.

Remove the medium T3 Solanum crispum (Potato tree) located at the back of property right side. Leave stump low.

Dismantle the medium T4 Apple located at the back of property. Leave stump low. Remove resulting debris.

## 7. Identification Of Tree(s) And Description Of Works

Prune T5 Malus Crabapple located at the back of property right side according to the following specifications:

- Thin by 15% remove all crossing branches selective prune into a more compact shape.
- Prune T6 Pear located at the back of property according to the following specifications:
- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune T7 Pear located at the left side rear garden according to the following specifications:

- Reduce vertical branches and re-shape the tree

Prune T8 Pitosporum located at the back of property left side according to the following specifications:

- Tidy tree up selective pruning of sides#
