1 Reasons for granting permission:



The applicant has submitted tree protection measures to be installed prior to construction. The details submitted include protection of two trees on land adjoining the site, follow the British guidelines, have been prepared by a suitably qualified arboriculturalist, include monitoring details, measures to ensure trees on adjoining land are not water logged, including contingency measures as required by the condition. Overall, the information provided is considered suitable in demonstrating compliance with the requirements of Condition 5 and it is recommended the condition be discharged.

The planning and appeal history of the site has been taken into account when coming to this decision.

The proposed development is in general accordance with the policy CS15 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy 2010.
