First and foremost the Gondar Gardens reservoir is one of the last green and open spaces in what is gradually becoming a densely populated area. It is a natural habitat for a number of protected and red-listed species and a unique green lung of West Hampstead, a district receiving elevated pollution levels from the extreme traffic of A41, A5 and North Circular Road and the nearby railway. Allowing housing development in this area will not only fail to preserve the biodiversity but also deprive the citizens of West Hampstead of a highly valuable area without air, noise and light pollution and instead further increase the pollution levels (ref. AQ103551R2 – Air Quality Assesment, point 1.2.). In the times of rising health threat from the galloping pollution levels in London and the global climate change, I find it

As for the structure and purpose of the development, I find the proposed plans absolutely inappropriate and incompatible with the area's needs. What we need from our Council is more well developed, AFFORDABLE housing for young people like me to afford to own their own space. Instead of this, we are being proposed an exclusive GATED retirement village which will only divide our community further into 'the better 1%' and all the rest of us – a loathsome idea. Not only will this particular development not provide any desperately needed services (affordable housing, public medical care, child care, school, police services...the list of priorities is long) but it will also strip us as members of the public from accessing the space, which I personally consider my full right and strongly object to any private company high jacking it in the name of their own profit.

In terms of the design of the proposed development, building a number of six-storey blocks in this particular residential area seems to be of an excessive height and bulk in comparison to the rest of the surrounding and also is completely inconsiderate to the immediate landscape.

Last but not least, during such an extensive development project, as Gondar Gardens residents we will be facing several years of noise and pollution generated by the construction of this absolutely poorly designed complex. Following this, we will be facing the challenges of increased traffic from service providers, employees, tenants and visitors to the facilities. This will not only highly impact on the calm and residential character of the area but also create elevated road traffic levels, problems with access to parking spaces and increased pollution.
