T3 oak Neighbouring garden (left) Very large specimen, with long, distended limbs extending upward from the old pollard points. The structure of the scaffold limbs is a concern given the rear garden location, and the weight and windsail of lateral limbs should be reduced. This work can improve the form, balance and appearance of the specimen and create a safe canopy contained to limit overdominance of the garden area. Proposed work: Reduce lateral and upper/lateral limbs by 3m by crop-crotching, shape to blend with the upper canopy. Remove tertiary limbs from the stem overhanging no. 15.
