

Hi Bethany,

I wish to make an objection to application 2017/6926/P (72 Cricklewood Broadway), but as per the communication chain with Andrew below, this is **solely** as a private individual and neighbour of the property (my address is Flat C, 70 Cricklewood Broadway, NW2 3EP) - and not in any way connected with my position on the council. I therefore trust that you will treat this objection as you feel is most appropriate.

My objection relates solely to the creation of a mansard roof, and not to any internal renovations. My reason for objecting is that the mansard will break an unspoiled row of roof lines which date back more than a century, stretching all the way along the terrace from 62 to 80 Cricklewood Broadway. An identical roof line exists on the opposite side of the road from 63 to 81 (albeit that this side of the road falls under the London Borough of Brent).

Although I understand that provision for retaining existing historic roof lines is normally only applied within conservation areas, I believe that consideration should also be made in this case. To allow a mansard roof to be built along this terrace would spoil the existing historic architecture.
