Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. The supply of alcohol is prohibited at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises.
- 2. The supply of alcohol is prohibited at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must —
 (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or(b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.
- 5. But nothing in subsection (4) requires such a condition to be imposed -
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to -
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- 6. For the purposes of this section-
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies[and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act)], and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.
- 7. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the



purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring:
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 8. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 9. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 10. (a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (b) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the



policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 11. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- 12. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 13. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 12
 - (a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b)"permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i)the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e)"valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 14. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of 13 above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-



- paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 15. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 16. Substantial Food and suitable non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 17. An incident book shall be kept and be available for inspection by the statutory authorities.
- 18. Any alcohol sold for consumption off the premises shall be sold in a sealed container.
- 19. With the exception of private events, in the area hatched black on the plan (or such area as agreed with the Licensing Authority), alcohol shall only be sold to customers at tables taking a table meal and served by waiter/waitress service.
- 20. CCTV cameras and recorders shall be installed at the premises to a standard acceptable to and approved by the Police.
- 21. The CCTV system shall be maintained in good working order and at all times the premises is open to the public.
- 22. The medium on which CCTV images are recorded shall be stored securely and shall be retained for a period of 31 days and shall be available for inspection by the police or an authorised council officer upon request.
- 23. At all times when the premises are open for the purposes of licensable activities, a suitably trained member of staff shall be present to assist the police or an authorised officer in obtaining the CCTV footage.
- 24. Save for bona-fide off sales in sealed containers, management will ensure that patrons do not take alcohol and/or food away from the venue to consume in the surrounding areas of Stable Street in the Coal Drops Zone or elsewhere in the Kings Cross Redevelopment zone.
- 25. At least one CCTV camera is to be placed near the exit and positioned at an



- appropriate level in order to capture clear facial images of all persons leaving the premises.
- 26. Notices shall be displayed within the premises warning customers about personal thefts; and to be vigilant.
- 27. When the venue is open for licensable activities, the toilets are to be checked regularly by staff.
- 28. No persons carrying visibly open or sealed vessels shall be admitted to the premises at any time that the premises are open for any licensable activity, save for those that have been purchased in the external area.
- 29. The licensee shall ensure that staff are trained, as appropriate, in respect of relevant licensing law, crime scene best practice and upon the sale of alcohol of drunks and persons underage.
- 30. Regular litter and glass collections shall be periodically carried out in all areas where customers are congregating.
- 31. The external area of the premises shall be appropriately demarked and agreed by the Licensing Authority.
- 32. Notices shall be prominently displayed at the premises reminding customers to leave quietly.
- 33. Staff shall regularly supervise the pavement area outside the premises to ensure customers are not blocking pavements or causing nuisance to neighbouring premises.
- 34. Save for persons temporarily leaving the premises to smoke, the use of the external area shall be restricted to 07:00 23:30 Monday to Thursday, 07:00 00:00 Friday to Saturday and 08:00 22:30 Sundays.
- 35. Before 23:00 hours, the noise climate of the surrounding area shall be protected such that the A-weighted equivalent continuous noise level (LAeq) emanating from the application site, as measured one metre from any façade of any noise sensitive premises over any five minute period with entertainment taking place, shall not increase by more than 5dB as compared to the same measure, from the same position, and over a comparable period, with no entertainment taking place; and the unweighted equivalent noise level (Leq) in the 63Hz Octave band, measured using the "fast" time constant, inside any living room of any noise sensitive premises, with the windows open or closed, over any five minute period with entertainment taking place, should show no increase as compared to the same measure, from the same location(s), and over a comparable period, with no entertainment taking place.



- 36. After 23:00 hours, the noise climate of the surrounding area shall be protected such that the A-weighted equivalent continuous noise level (LAeq) emanating from the application site, as measured one metre from any façade of any noise sensitive premises over any five minute period with entertainment taking place, shall not increase by more than 3dB as compared to the same measure, from the same position, and over a comparable period, with no entertainment taking place; and the unweighted equivalent noise level (Leq) in the 63Hz Octave band, measured using the "fast" time constant, inside any living room of any noise sensitive premises, with the windows open or closed, over any five minute period with entertainment taking place, should show no increase as compared to the same measure, from the same location(s), and over a comparable period, with no entertainment taking place.
- 37. The premises shall adopt the "Challenge 21" scheme and any person wishing to purchase alcohol who appears to be under 21 shall be asked to produce an acceptable form of identification (photographic UK driving licence, passport, PASS accredited and/or armed forces card).
