I am a resident at 45 New Compton street, WC2, and am forwarding my comment on Application 2017/5233/P - About Floodlighting Church 'St Giles in the Fields'

The lights are very very bright indeed, I was home when the testing with the lights was done. Blackout curtains will probably show the very bright lights from the top and sides probably. It is a good idea to 'brighten up' the area & church, but after seeing the testing with the lighting it feels the artificial brightness is even stronger than the natural light on a sunny day in the flat here.

Could the lighting be dimmed?

Or follow suggestions to only direct the lighting on some parts of the church that are Not opposite or adjacent to our building at 45 New Compton street.

(It would save money on top of things!)

I do agree with my neighbours Ryan + LeBinh at 45 NCS that it will be too bright for us if the lighting is directed onto the facades West + South, and also agree with respecting the residents by focusing the lighting on North + West facades of the church.

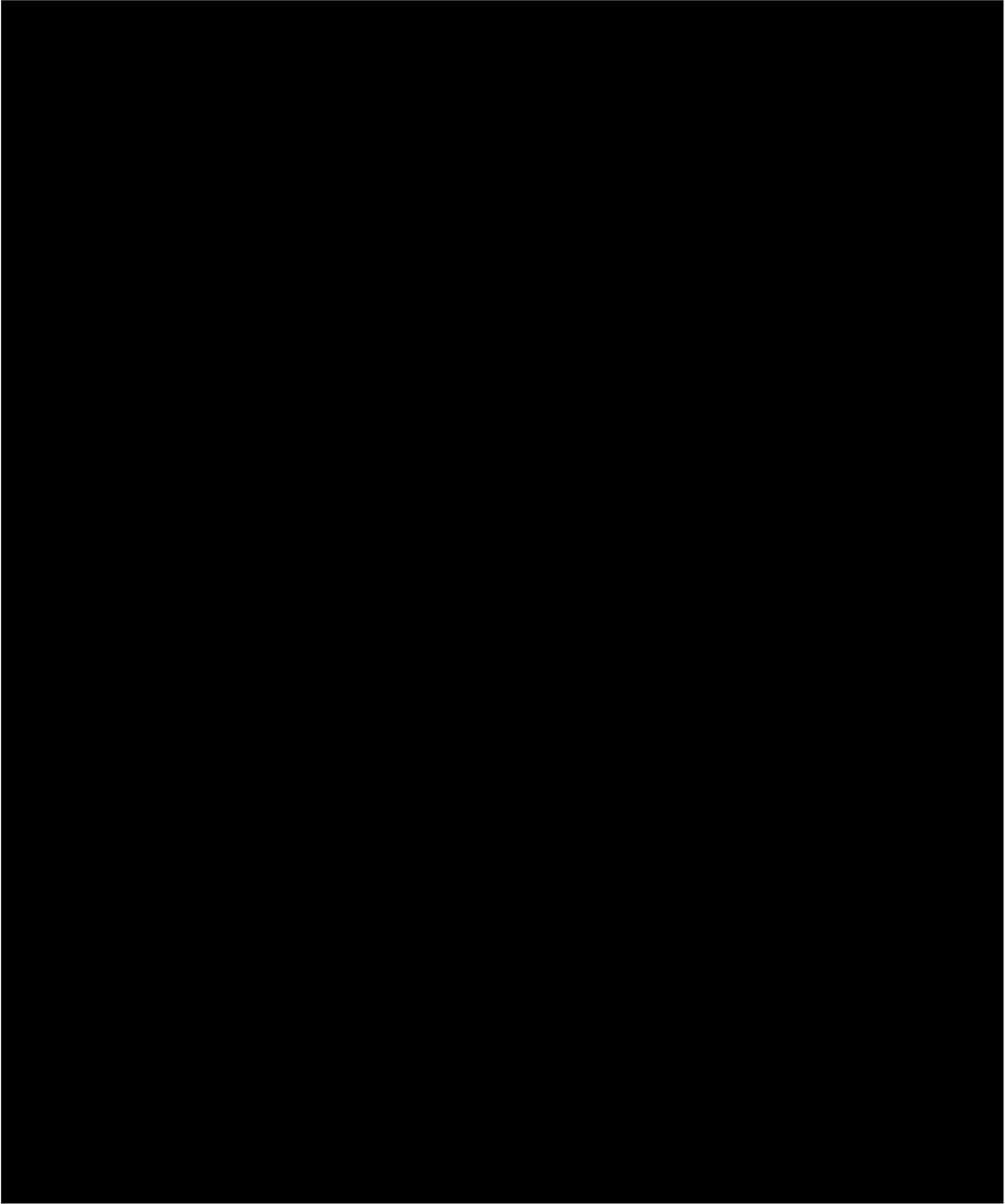
