Hi Liam,

I'm not sure how much information Steve had already given you with regards maintenance and irrigation but one of the great advantages of sedum is that it pretty much looks after itself.

From an irrigation point of view Mother Nature usually provides enough water but if there is a period of prolonged drought and high heat then a dowsing with a hose will benefit the plants. This would mean somewhere in the region of a month, which I am sure you will agree is very rare in this country.

As for maintenance, a light weeding and general fertiliser at the start of the growing season and possibly again at the end is advised. Obviously there will be a certain amount of detritus carried by the wind that may have to be removed on a more regular basis but this will be determined by the location of the roof.

As with all living things the better you treat them the better they will survive. So although sedum is pretty much bullet proof if they were to feed and weed it more regularly I'm sure there would be even more improvement in the appearance.
