

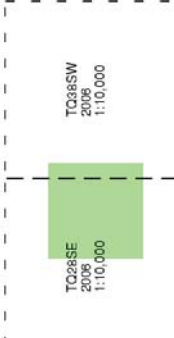
# 10k Raster Mapping

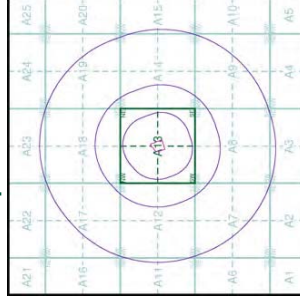

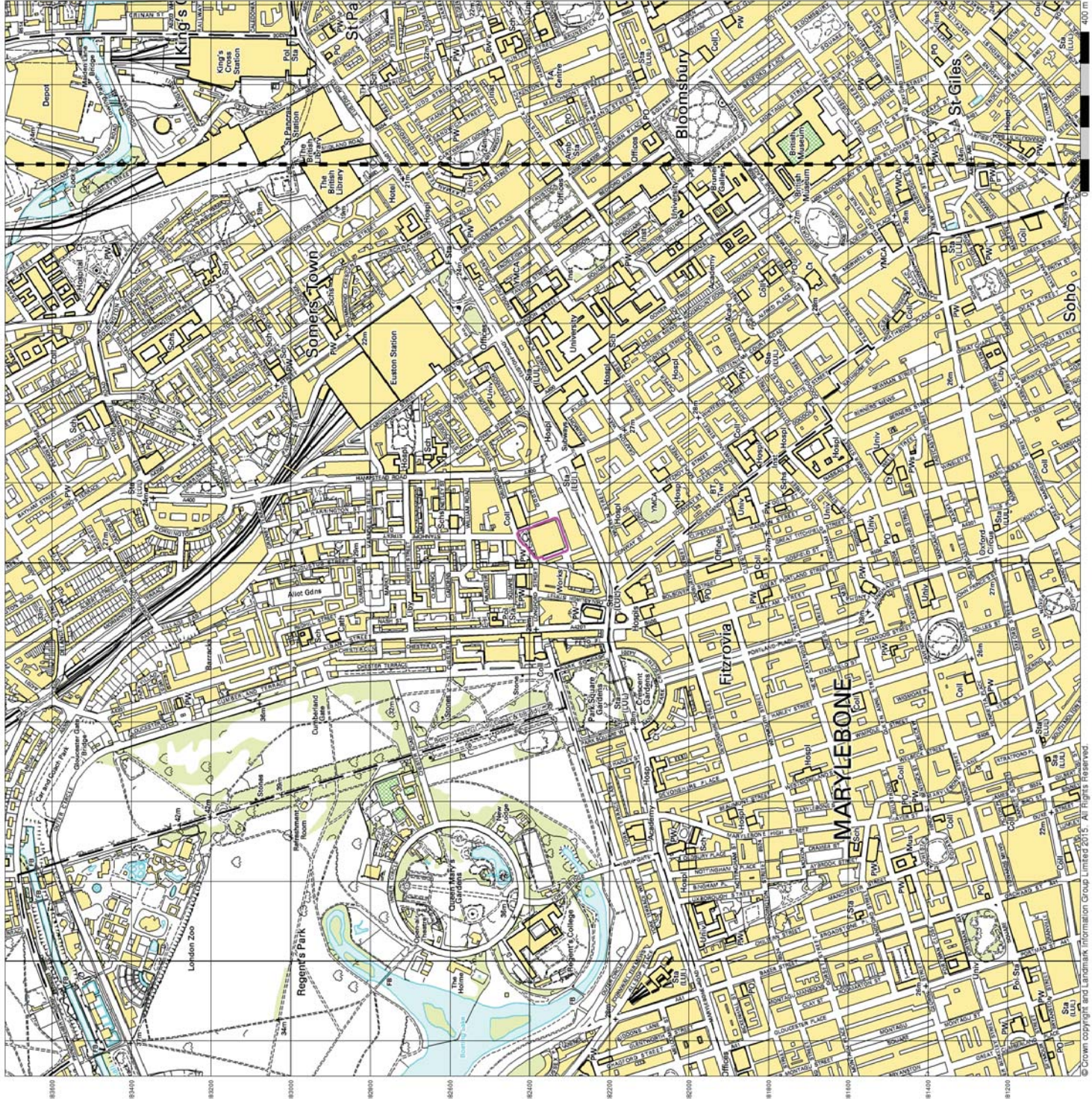

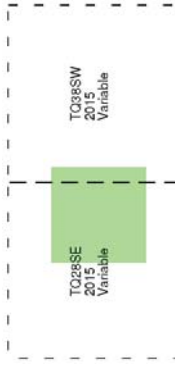
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## VectorMap Local Published 2015

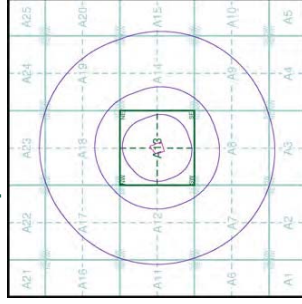

VectorMap Local (Raster) is Ordnance Survey's highest detailed 'backdrop' mapping product available. It is produced using OS's VectorMap Local, a vector data set at a scale of 1:10,000, overlaid on the UK's OS Grid Britain, that has been designed for creating graphical OS VectorMap Local. It is derived from large-scale information surveyed at 1:250 scale (covering major towns and cities), 1:2500 scale (smaller towns, villages and developed rural areas), and 1:10,000 scale (mountain, moorland and river estuary areas).

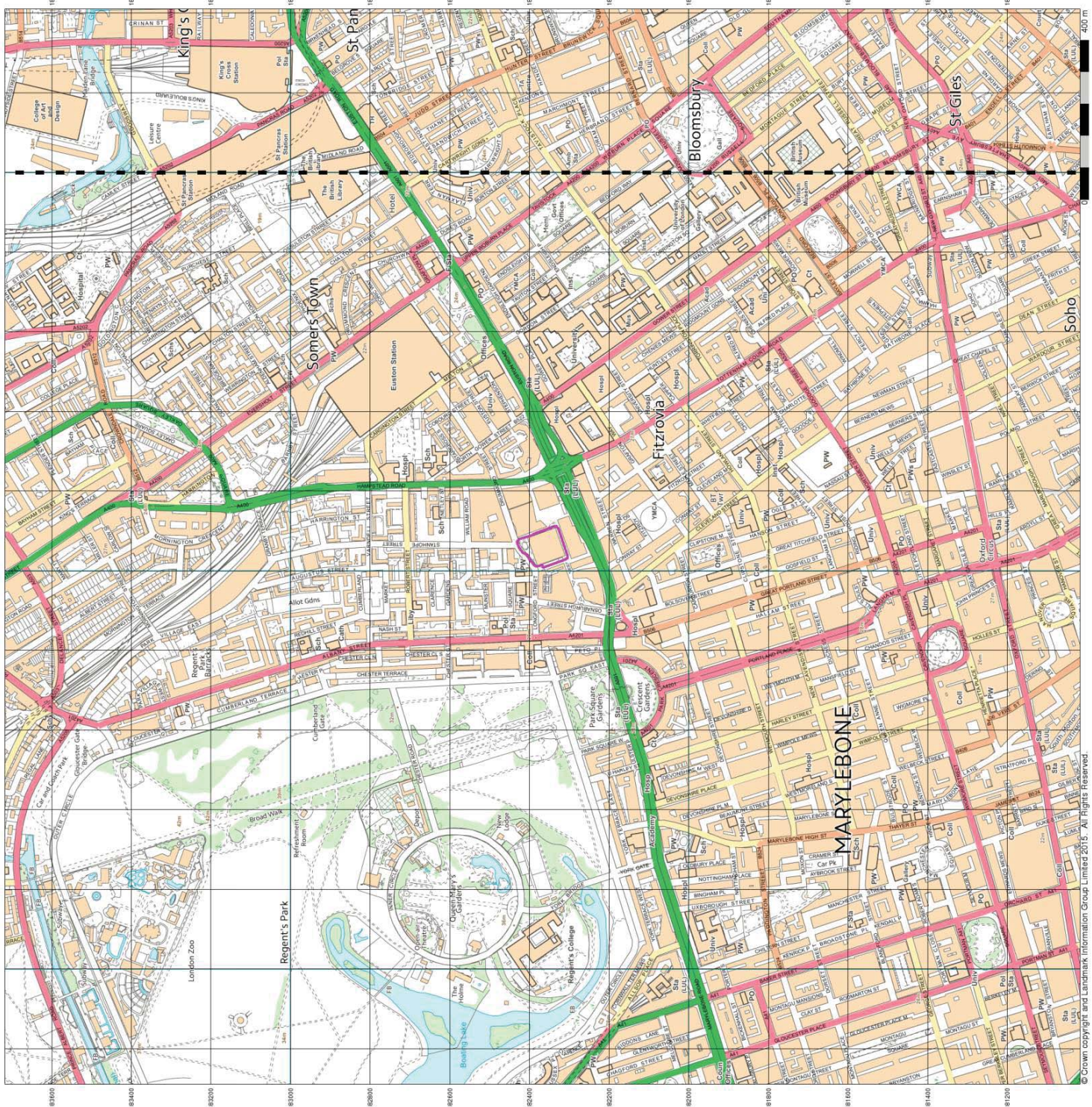

### Historical Mapping Legends

#### Large-Scale National Grid Data 1:2,500 and 1:1,250

This legend defines symbols for various geographical features and structures. It includes symbols for slopes, cliffs, rock, boulders, positioned boulders, non-coniferous trees (surveyed and not surveyed), orchards, coppice, rough grassland, direction of water flow, triangulation stations, electricity transmission lines, pylons, buildings with seed, roofed buildings, and various boundaries (civil parish/community, district, county, and boundary post/stone). It also lists symbols for barracks, battery, cemetery, chimney, cistern, dismantled railway, electricity generating station, electricity pole, electricity substation, filter bed, fountain/drinkin' fn., gas valve compound, gas valve, guide post, manhole, mile post, and millstone.

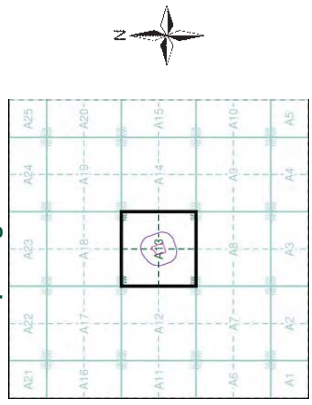
#### Ordnance Survey Plan, Additional SIMs and Supply of Unpublished Survey Information 1:2,500 and 1:1,250

This legend defines symbols for features found in Ordnance Survey plans and additional SIMs. It includes symbols for inactive quarries, rock, roofed buildings, sloping masonry, archways, non-coniferous trees, orchards, coppice, rough grassland, direction of water flow, cave entrances, electricity pylons, county boundaries, civil parish boundaries, administrative boundaries, and London Borough boundaries. It also lists symbols for beer houses, boundary post/stone, capstans, chimneys, drinking fountains, fire alarm pillars, footbridges, guide posts, hydrants, level crossings, manholes, mile posts, and normal tidal limits.

#### Ordnance Survey County Series and Ordnance Survey Plan 1:2,500

This legend defines symbols for county series and 1:2,500 scale plans. It includes symbols for quarries, clay pits, sloping masonry, marsh, rough pasture, mixed wood, fir, ferry, trig stations, bench marks, surface levels, antiques, cutting, embankment, road crossings, level crossings, railway crossings, rivers/canals, county boundaries, administrative boundaries, county borough boundaries, and county borough boundaries in Scotland. It also lists symbols for bridge roads, electricity pylons, footpaths, footbridges, guide posts, mile stones, mooring posts, and police call boxes.

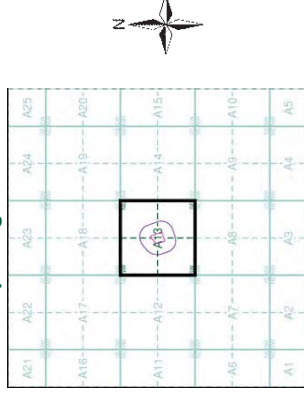

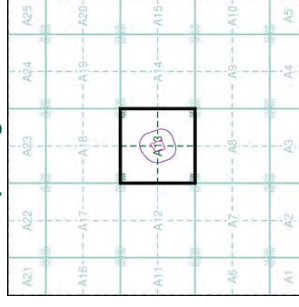

Before 1938 all OS maps were based on the Cassini Projection, with independent surveys of a single county or group of counties, giving rise to significant inaccuracies in outlying areas.

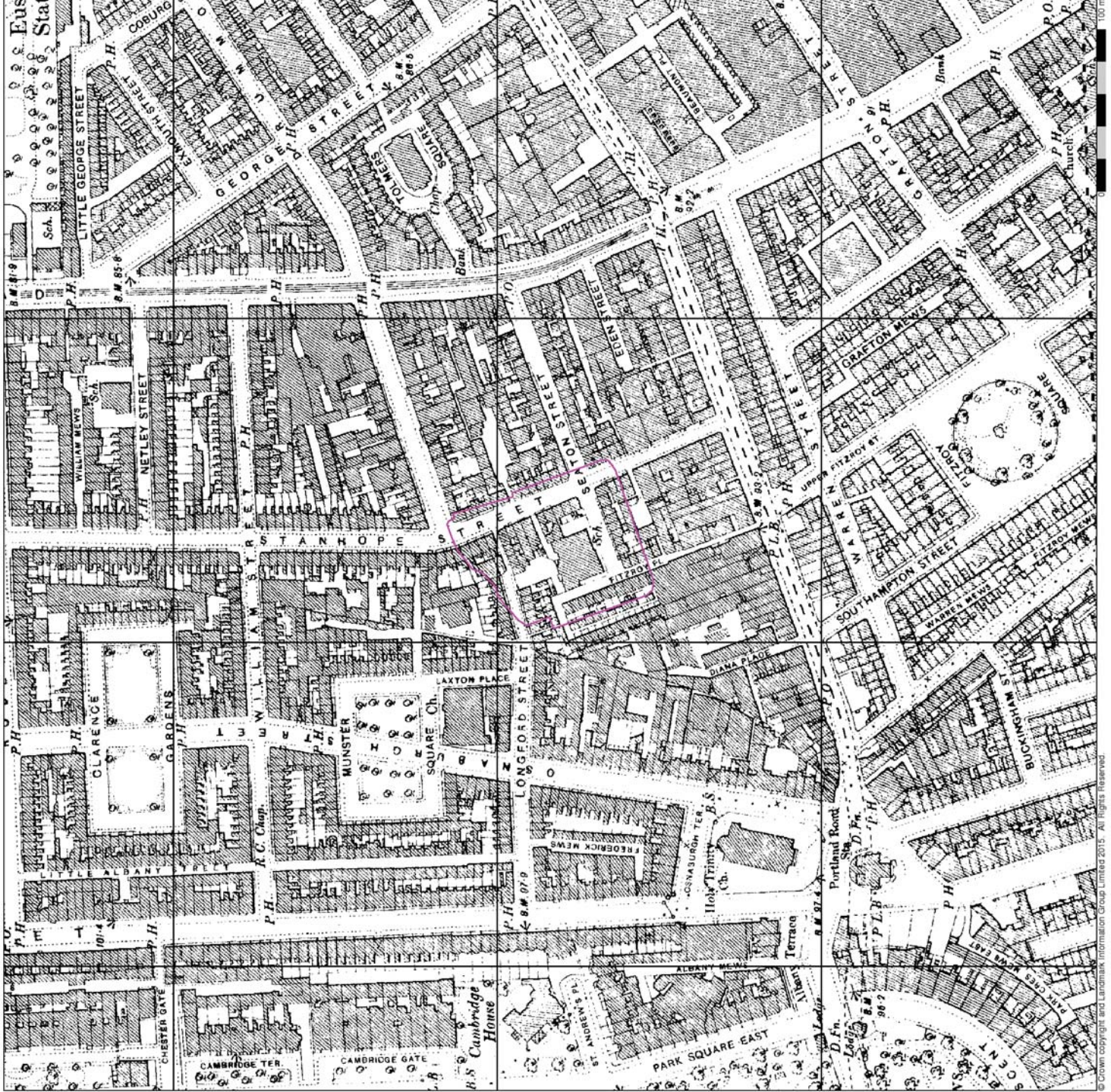

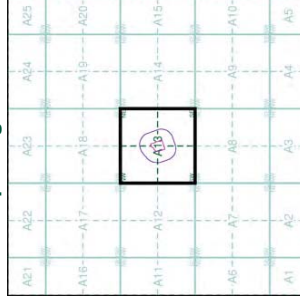

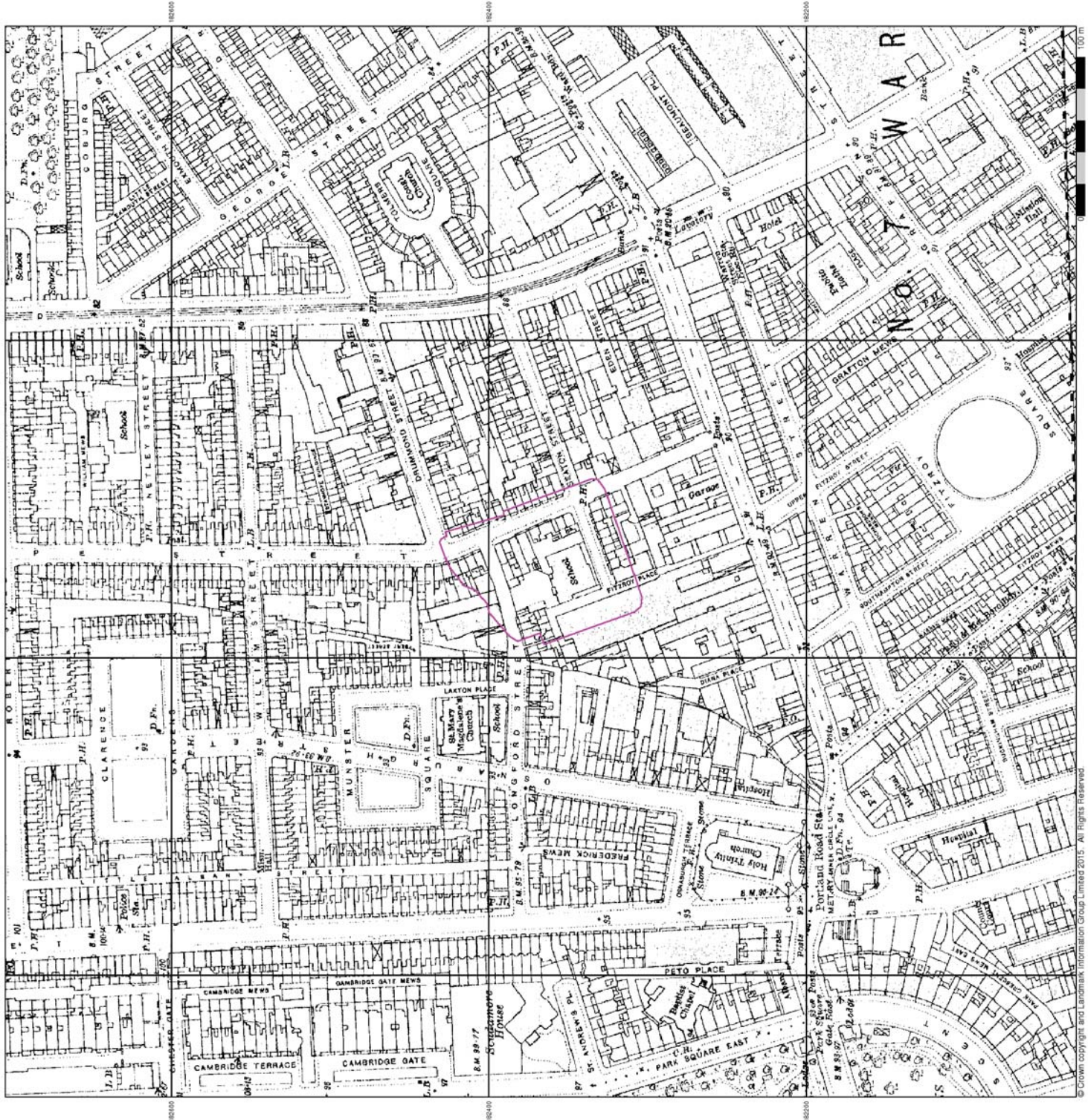


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# Historical Aerial Photography Published 1946 - 1949

Source map scale - 1:1,250

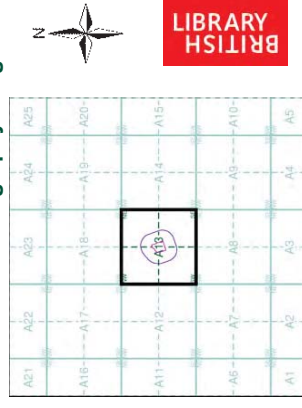
The Historical Aerial Photos were produced by the Ordnance Survey at a scale of 1:1,250 and 1:10,560 m Air Force photography. They were prepared by the Ordnance Survey in 1944 and 1945 as part of the preparation of conventional mapping. Due to post war security concerns, the photos were checked for potentially unsafe information with security sites replaced by fake fields or clouds. The original editions were withdrawn and only later made available after a period of fifty years although due to the accuracy of the editing, without viewing both revisions it is not easy to spot the edits. Where available Landmark have included both revisions.

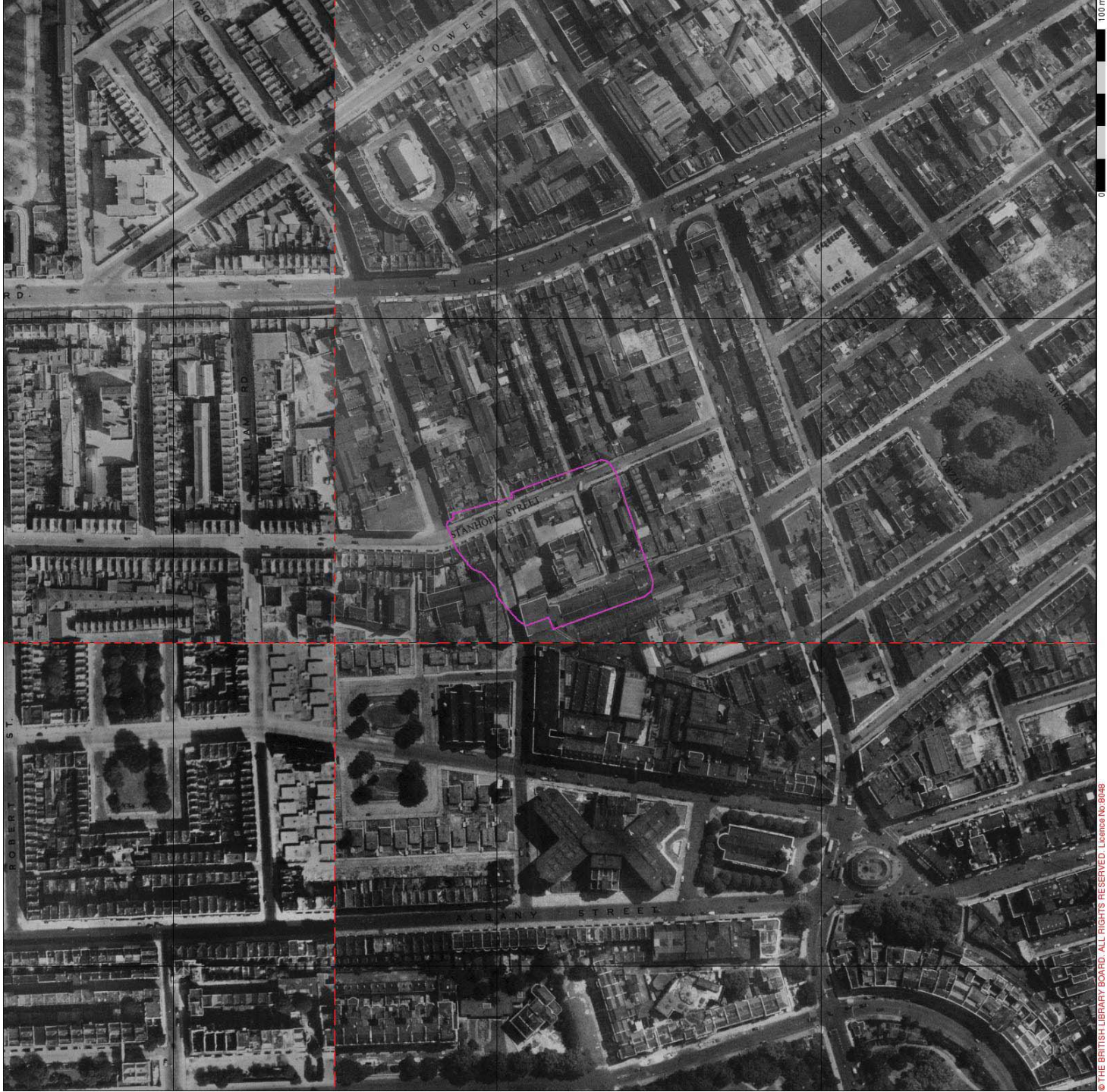

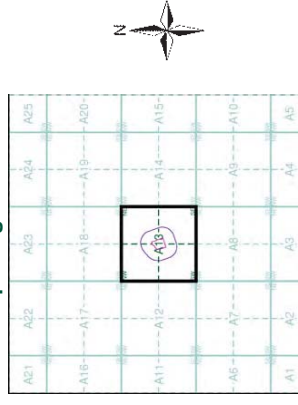

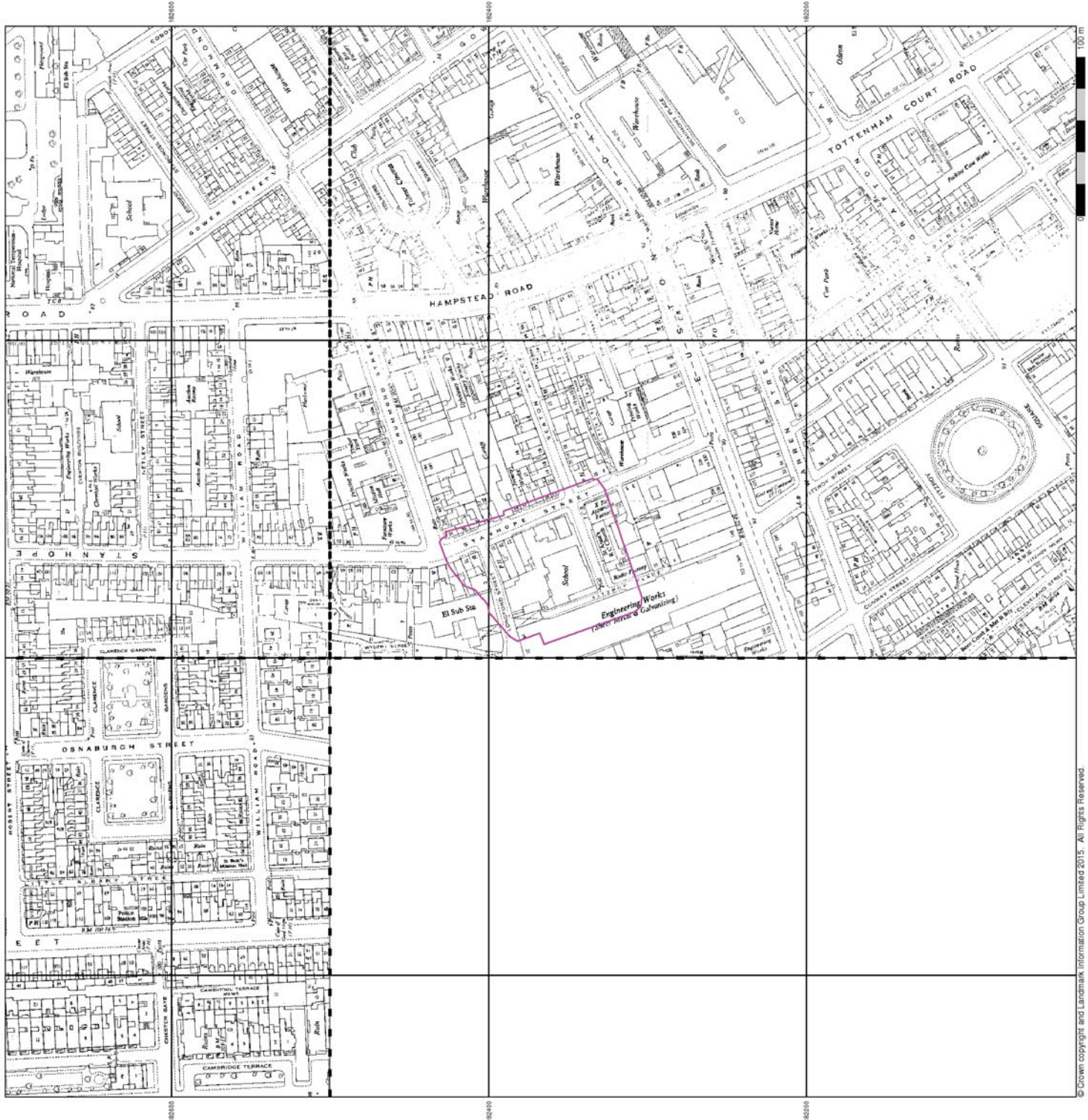


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## Ordnance Survey Plan Published 1954

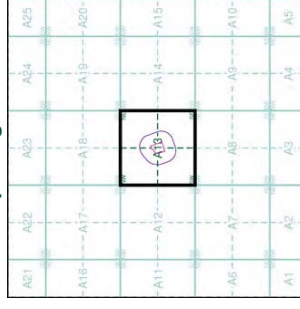
Source map scale - 1:2,500

The 1854 edition was adopted for England, Wales and Scotland in 1940. In 1946, the 1854 edition was replaced by the 1954 edition, which was published in 1954. It covered the whole of what was then considered to be the cultivated parts of Great Britain. The published date given below is often some years later than the surveyed date. Before 1938 all OS maps were based on the Cassini Projection, with independent surveys of a single county or group of counties, giving rise to significant inaccuracies in outlying areas.
