From the plans it appears that the proposed extension will include lengthening the first floor balcony so that it projects further out towards Hampstead Way. I am concerned that this extension will reduce both my light and my privacy significantly . 2. It will also alter the aspect of the terrace when viewed from Hampstead Way. 3. It is unclear from the plans whether the proposed roof of the kitchne extension is higher than the current kitchen roof but this is of concern to me also- for the effect it may have on my light and privacy. 4. The party wall of no. 7. 8.8 will be affected by the extension of the garden of no.8 out towards the pavement of Hampstead way. As will my beautiful and very old Wisteria tree which lies adjacent to the party wall on my side and may not survive the digging down which would be involved in moving the outer garden wall. 5.
