Thank you for your letter/telephone call of 22 January 2018 giving notice that the above tree(s) are considered dead/dying /dangerous and require emergency works.

The Council confirms that the remedial works as described above are exempt from the need for further notifications or any formal application to the Council and you are therefore allowed to proceed.

Informative(s):

- 1 You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- 2 Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Of particular note is


Conditions and Reasons:

- 1 During the first available planting season following the completion one tree of a species to be confirmed in writing shall be planted as a heavy standard with a girth size of 12-14 cms, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the local authority. The tree shall be planted and maintained to the standards set out in BS8545:2014. The tree shall be planted within the rear garden at least 1m away from any structure.

Reason: To ensure the trees on site continue to contribute to the visual amenity and character of the area, in accordance with the requirements of policy A3 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017
