Soft Landscape Maintenance Schedules



This maintenance schedule details when maintenance work items are to be carried out. In each identified month, the number in the shaded box details the number of times per month when a work item is to be carried out. Where a number "1" is indicated, the maintenance work item must be carried out once a month at the beginning of the month. Where a number "2" is indicated, the maintenance work item must be carried out twice in the month, once at the beginning of the month and the second occurrence mid-way through the month. AR indicates that an operation should be carried out as required.
