REFUSAL OF CONSENT FOR WORKS TO TREE/S UNDER A TREE PRESERVATION ORDER

Address: Elm Village (comprising Barker Drive **Rossendale Wav** St Pancras Way **Bergholt Mews & Blakeney Close)** London NW1

Proposal: TPO REF (C649) VARIOUS WORKS TO VARIOUS TREES, including: 4 x Ash - Fell 2 x Sycamore - Fell 1 x Paulownia - Fell

The Council has considered your application dated 24 January 2018 and decided to refuse consent for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The application is for various works to various trees, including tree removals, from communal areas within a privately owned and managed housing estate.



The site has a high number of trees for a housing estate given its inner-London location. The trees are considered to significantly contribute to the character of the area and are much enjoyed by its residents.

While it is considered that some of the proposed works are appropriate, there are major failings in the application. The plan submitted with the application is incorrect, showing trees in the wrong locations. Many trees are misidentified.

No justification for the works was included with the application. When justification for the works was requested, the reasons given were not considered robust enough e.g. the presence of a fungal bracket with no reference to or quantification of associated decay should decay be present.

No details of replacement planting were included with the application. When details were requested the response given was that "replanting would not be an option due to the lack of space and the high density of trees in other areas. The council does not share this view.

It is considered likely that an application to carry out some tree works at the site would be approved, however the trees should be resurveyed and the application be revised and resubmitted with proportionate justification.

The application has been refused to protect the visual amenity the trees provide and the character of the area.
