Dear Mr Little,

As explained to you during our phone call at the beginning of March, my clients Mr and Mrs Gore would like to seek approval to remove the lime tree located in the front garden of their property at 14 Keats Grove, NW3 2RS.

As shown in picture 1 the tree is located in the left-hand-side corner of their property, along the street boundary when standing in the street looking towards the house.

As it grew bigger the tree has become an increasing nuisance over the years as shown on the pictures below:

the rooting system and lower growth of the lime has destroyed the boundary wall separating Mr and Mrs Grove's property from their neighbours'. The fence is now also impacted. The rooting system has developed so much that it is now impossible to either re-build the wall, or use a solid fence panel to separate the two properties

- Picture 3 and 4 highlight other problems:

i) the steps leading from the street to the refuse section are unusable unless the lower growth of the tree is constantly being kept in check.

ii) The bins used to be neatly fenced away totally out of sight from the street and the house. The rooting and lower growth of the tree having spread to the entire area, the refuse section has become unusable.

iii) The tree is growing at a marked angle towards the RHS and it is a matter of time before the gate can no longer open.

For the above reasons, we are kindly asking for approval to remove the tree.

Mr and Mrs Gore are firm believers of the importance of nature for wildlife and have spent the last 25 years improving their front and back gardens to make it wild-life friendly. As such, they would be delighted to replace the existing lime tree by a native silver birch, which would be planted in the same area, just a little further away from the front boundary wall and side fenced boundary.
